1-Fluoro-2-nitrobenzene (CAS No. 1493-27-2) (provided for in subheading 2904.90.30).

The subject product is a synthetic organic chemical that is a yellow liquid with an almond odor. It is used as a raw material in the production of an intermediate chemical, which is then used to produce a pharmaceutical. The product is imported from France.

A BILL

To extend the duty suspension on 1-Fluoro-2-nitrobenzene.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. 1-FLUORO-2-NITROBENZENE.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Heading 9902.11.37 of the Har-
5 monized Tariff Schedule of the United States (relating to
6 1-Fluoro-2-nitrobenzene) is amended by striking “12/31/
7 2009” and inserting “12/31/2011”.

8 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
9 subsection (a) applies with respect to goods entered, or
10 withdrawn from warehouse for consumption, on or after

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1 the date that is 15 days after the date of enactment of
2 this Act.

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
